Dear friends,

As the crisp air of late autumn settles in and the year gently draws to a close, we look back with deep satisfaction on a truly remarkable chapter of our shared photographic journey: the recently concluded FIAP Photo Meeting in China.

At the same time, our gaze turns forward with great enthusiasm to the next major milestone on the FIAP calendar, the 2026 FIAP Congress, which will take place in Brazil, and we are delighted to share with you the latest updates.

Celebrating the FIAP Photo Meeting in China

The 9th FIAP Photo Meeting took place this summer in the enchanting and culturally rich province of Hunan, China, officially opening on August 23.

It brought together more than 315 photographers from 40 countries, united by a common passion for photography and for building bridges across cultures.

Once again, it was a truly extraordinary event, superbly organized, following the success of the 2017 Photo Meeting in Shandong, by our dear friend Prof. Zeng Yi, Director of the FIAP Chinese Coordinating Office in Jinan, with the precious collaboration of his dedicated team, including our friend Lu Ming.

With the invaluable support of the local authorities, among them the Vice-Governor of Hunan Province, this event became a vibrant mosaic of cultures, experiences, and passions, a true celebration of friendship that sent a powerful message to the world:

that our shared love for photography can break down barriers, overcome prejudices, and build enduring bonds among peoples - beyond languages, beyond political, social, or religious differences.

And this, in essence, is the heart and soul of FIAP: to promote and disseminate photographic knowledge at the artistic, educational, and scientific levels, in harmony with the principles of UNESCO.

The program of the Photo Meeting offered a perfect balance between exhibitions, cultural exchanges, and photographic discovery.

The official opening, held at the Meixi Lake International Culture & Arts Center in Changsha, presented prestigious FIAP exhibitions such as the 22nd FIAP Nature Biennial, the 19th FIAP World Cup for Clubs, the personal exhibition of István Kerekes, *Best of FIAP 2023/2024*, and the debut exhibition of the FIAP International Medical Photographers Club.

The journey then unfolded through a succession of breathtaking locations; from the ancient town of Furong, where time seems to flow to the rhythm of the waterfall and the songs of the Tujia people, to the Red Stone Forest, the Dehang Grand Canyon, and the picturesque Miao villages, each revealing a different facet of Hunan's cultural and natural richness.

The itinerary culminated at the world-renowned Zhangjiajie National Forest Park, whose spectacular sandstone pillars, rising like silent giants amid the mist, famously inspired the floating mountains in the film 'Avatar'. It was the perfect finale to an unforgettable photographic adventure, filled with emotion, discovery, and beauty beyond words.

The extension of the Photo Meeting then offered nearly 180 photographers the unforgettable opportunity to board a special charter flight to the equally magnificent Inner Mongolia, a land of vast horizons and timeless beauty.

Starting from Xilinhot, participants embarked on an extraordinary photographic journey across endless grasslands, immersing themselves in the ancient traditions and vibrant culture of this fascinating region and capturing the majestic Mongolian horses galloping freely under boundless skies.

It was a dream come true for every photographer; a journey of light, nature, and humanity that will long be remembered by all those fortunate enough to have taken part in it.

At the conclusion of the official FIAP Photo Meeting program, FIAP expressed its deepest gratitude to all organizers, collaborators, and volunteers for their impeccable work and outstanding dedication.

A special tribute was paid to Professor Zeng Yi, the true driving force and visionary behind this exceptional event.

For his extraordinary contribution to FIAP's international mission and a lifetime devoted to the promotion of FIAP, Professor Zeng Yi was honoured with the FIAP Lifetime Achievement Award; the highest FIAP distinction for organizational merit. There will be more about the conferring of this Lifetime Achievement Award in the next edition of FIAP News.

This newly established distinction, created by FIAP in 2025, was presented for the very first time on this occasion, making the moment even more significant and memorable.

The FIAP Board of Directors also decided to confer the title of FIAP Honorary Member upon Mr. Chen Kai, General Manager of Hunan Silk Road Culture Exchange Co., Ltd., in recognition of his invaluable contribution to the success of the event. This title, bestowed for the first time at this event, is conferred on people who are outside the FIAP structure.

This distinction, established in 2025, reflects FIAP's commitment to acknowledging and honouring those who make an exceptional contribution to its international mission.

Looking Ahead: The FIAP Congress 2026 in Brazil

Looking to the future, during the FIAP Congress held in Jaipur in 2024, Brazil, and more precisely the city of Salvador de Bahia, officially presented and obtained approval for its candidacy to host the 37th FIAP Congress, to be held in the early days of August 2026.

A subsequent on-site visit, carried out in September 2025, was aimed at assessing the suitability of the facilities and logistical conditions in Salvador de Bahia.

Following this evaluation, and in close collaboration with Carlos Gandara, President of COMFOTO (Confederação Brasileira de Fotografia), as well as with our friends and partners in Salvador de

Bahia, a joint decision was made to relocate the Congress to Rio de Janeiro, a city offering broader infrastructure and accommodation capacity, capable of meeting the needs of an international event of this scale.

This decision in no way diminishes our esteem and appreciation for Salvador de Bahia, a city of extraordinary charm, history, and hospitality, which will, in fact, soon become one of the destinations for the upcoming FIAP Photo Days. Rather, it simply reflects the logistical and organizational requirements necessary for the successful realization of the 2026 Congress.

We are confident that by choosing Rio de Janeiro, FIAP will offer its members from all over the world a Congress that will not only be flawlessly organized, but also rich in artistic inspiration and unforgettable experiences.

Preparations are already underway: venues, hospitality packages, local partnerships, and the overall program structure are currently being finalized.

In the coming months, detailed information will be provided regarding the administrative program, side events, excursions, and registration procedures.

We warmly invite all national federations and their member clubs to make a note on their calendars that the Congress will be in early August 2026 (dates to be finalised soon).

This promises to be another major FIAP milestone, celebrating photography, friendship, and cultural exchange in one of the most beautiful and photogenic countries in the world.



Final Reflections

The 9th FIAP Photo Meeting in China and the upcoming 2026 Congress in Brazil perfectly embody FIAP's international spirit; its ability to build bridges between cultures and its unwavering commitment to photographic excellence.

We carry with us the inspiration born in China and look forward with great enthusiasm to Brazil 2026, ready to strengthen our bonds, broaden our horizons, and celebrate together the beauty of photographic art.

FIAP Biennials Service

FIAP Biennials 2026

FIAP Biennials are competitions between countries with an Operational Member (a photographic organization affiliated with FIAP that act at a national level) that is a member of FIAP. Individuals interested in participating should approach the FIAP affiliated organization within their country to seek information about their country's process for selecting photos to represent their country in this event.

Each federation will select the works (the collections) it wants to present. Each collection has to be a coherent set of images. To achieve the best coherence, consideration should be given to the inspiration and conception of the set, as well as the realisation and the presentation. Each federation has the choice of subject and the presentation of its works. A title for the collection is mandatory. Participation in the Biennial is free. The works must not have been sent to any previous FIAP Biennials. The images must not have any signature, text or distinctive mark on them.

The photographers must preserve intact, and without any alteration, the original metadata of the images. If an image does not include the original EXIF data, it will not be eligible to participate in the Biennials. In the case of a file being requested, the person representing the federation must send it promptly within 10 days of the request. If the file is not sent and received within the deadline, the submitted image will be disqualified (namely 0 points will be assigned to that photo). In the case of focus stacking, composite photos or HDR it is mandatory to submit all the original camera files used for the final image.

23rd FIAP Nature Biennial, South Africa 2026

In 2026 the 23rd FIAP Nature Biennial is being organised in South Africa. The FIAP Operational Member for South Africa is the "The Photographic Society of South Africa - PSSA".

The biennial consists of two sections:

Prints: limited to 10 photographs per federation with a maximum of one (1) work per author

Digital images: limited to 20 works per federation with a maximum of two (2) works per author

IMPORTANT:

The images that participate in this Biennial must conform to the definition of Nature given by FIAP (which is also included in the regulations).

Images should be in JPG, sRGB, 300 dpi.

Image size: 2400 pixels minimum and 3500 pixels maximum for the largest side. Maximum file size 6 MB.

Remember, if you participate in the print section, you must also upload a digital version of those works.



This event is a new opportunity to achieve the important **Nature Trophy “Odette Bretscher 2026”**. For this, the results of the two sections of this Biennial will be taken into account. The federation that obtains the best overall result will win the Trophy.

FIAP will invite a member of the winning federation to receive the Trophy at the next Congress (including travel expenses).

Closing date: 15/11/2025

For entries in the digital section, the closing date may be extended. Please contact the Director of the Biennials, Luis Franke.

Judging Date: 10/02/2026

Reports by: 10/04/2026

Opening ceremony – Port Elizabeth: 28/09/2026

The closing date is for registration. The prints must arrive before the judging date. It is recommended to send them with enough time to avoid any delays by the postal services.

37th FIAP Black and White Biennial, Brazil 2026

In 2026 the 37th FIAP Black and White Biennial will be organised in Brazil. The FIAP Operational Member for Brazil is the **“Confederação Brasileira de Fotografia - CONFOTO”**.

The Black and White Biennial consists of one section:

Prints: 10 photographs by 10 different authors

All styles and creative techniques are allowed. The participating works have to be in agreement with the FIAP definition of the Black and White photography (monochrome).

Calendar:

Upload start: 01/12/2025

Closing date: 31/01/2026

Judging Date: 21/03/2026

Results by: 20/05/2026

Opening and award ceremony: August 2026 (During the FIAP Congress)

A digital version of the prints must also be uploaded when registering. The prints must arrive before the judging date. It is recommended to send them with enough time to avoid any delays by the postal services.

The federation which obtains the best overall result in the combination of the two sections (prints and digital) of the 30th Colour Biennial Greece 2023 and the 37th Black & White Biennial 2026 wins the Grand Prize **“Dr. M. Van de Wijer Trophy” 2026**. The winner of the trophy will be invited to the next FIAP Congress (one person per country) to receive the prize. FIAP will offer free participation in the Congress including the travel expenses (in economy class).

Preparation and sending the prints

These are instructions and recommendations for the person of the federation in charge of sending the prints.

Send the prints to the address indicated in the Biennial's regulations in time to avoid delays in the postal service. Please consider the following:

- The maximum size of the prints must be 30x40 cm (A3 and 12"x16" formats are also accepted). Smaller prints (i.e. 20 x 30 cm) are acceptable.
- Send the photos packed flat (not rolled in tubes). For customs reasons avoid using large boxes.
- Please place the following text on the customs form: "Photos for exhibition. No commercial value."
- Inform the organizer of the mail tracking number

Include the following information on the back of each print:

- Name of the Operational Member (Federation)
- Country
- Photographers' name
- Title of the work
- Number indicating the sequence of the photo in the set

You can use the labels designed for this purpose by downloading them from the FIAP website:

The labels are a fillable pdf form and are easy to fill in. They can be printed on self-adhesive paper and then stuck to the back of the prints.

Remember that for judging of the photos, they will first be mixed with the entries from other countries for the images to be individually judged and then re-sorted to judge each collection's coherence. Correct labelling of prints will help organizers with handling them. Thank you for your cooperation!

20th FIAP World Cup for Clubs 2025 Entries Close Soon!

FIAP invite all photo clubs to participate in the 20th edition of the FIAP World Cup for Clubs, that is undoubtedly one of the most important and prestigious photography competitions organised by FIAP. In 2024, there were 5534 photos from 293 clubs, from 55 countries, involved in this competition.

The main feature of this great photographic competition is that it is open to all photography clubs of the world, whether FIAP members or not, in order to best represent photography worldwide. The competition subject is open. All genres and creative processes are allowed, in black and white or in color. There is no need for consistency between photographs. Pictures created by artificial intelligence are not allowed in this competition. All the parts of the image have to be photographed by the author who is holding the copyright of all works submitted.

This year FIAP are delighted to welcome the support of the company Skylum, makers of the photo editing software, Luminar Neo. This company have provided some prizes for the World Cup for Clubs. Each of the clubs ranked in the 10 positions in this competition will receive a Luminar Neo software license as a prize. FIAP thank Skylum for their generosity knowing this prize will be greatly appreciated by the winning clubs.

The online entry platform for this year's World Cup for Clubs competition opened 1st of October and the closing date is now only days away.

I would like to remind the clubs and their photographers that, to further promote this competition, FIAP introduced an important change regarding the entered works and the score they get in the FIAP World Cup for Clubs. Starting with the 17th FIAP World Cup for Clubs 2022, individual photographers can count their acceptances in the FIAP World Cup for Clubs for the purpose of their applications for individual FIAP distinctions. It is hoped that our decision will make this important event even more attractive and encourage the participation of more and more new photographers. In this regard, photographers who intend to use the acceptances they will obtain in this 2025 contest in their applications for individual FIAP distinctions, will have to use the official FIAP number "2025/900" and the country "Italy". I emphasize that this information is also available on the FIAP official website, where, on the FIAP World Cup for Clubs page, you can find a document indicating the FIAP numbers relating to past editions. The 9th FIAP Photo Meeting Successfully Held in Hunan, China

From August 22 to September 7, 2025, the 9th FIAP Photo Meeting unfolded across two distinct yet equally captivating landscapes in China: the cultural heartland of Hunan and the vast grasslands of Inner Mongolia. 315 photographers from 40 countries embarked on a 17-day odyssey, capturing the essence of ancient history, ethnic traditions, and breathtaking natural beauty through their lenses.

Phase 1: Hunan - Where History Meets Scenery (August 22 - 31)

The journey began in Changsha, Hunan's capital, where participants checked into the luxurious Langham Place Hotel and received welcome packages filled with event memorabilia and a T-shirt. The FIAP Board of Directors arrived earlier and held their meetings prior to the Photo Meeting activities commencing.

The opening ceremony at Meixi Lake International Culture & Art Center set the tone, featuring awards for the 22nd FIAP Nature Biennial, the 19th FIAP World Cup for Clubs, and the FIAP "Best of the Best". This was followed by exhibitions showcasing global photographic excellence, including the inaugural exhibition of FIAP's International Medical Photographers Club. In the exhibition hall, works of natural scenery and humanistic documentary photography complemented each other, while the free shooting session outside allowed photographers to capture the harmonious coexistence of modern architecture and urban light and shadow with their lenses. At the welcome dinner that night, FIAP President Riccardo Busi's speech and Hunan's characteristic cultural performances immersed guests in the charm of Hunan culture.

Starting from August 24, the photographers delved deep into the hinterland of Hunan. The bluestone roads and ancient docks of Jinggang Ancient Town carried the gentleness of a water town in the south of the Yangtze River, where photographers recorded the daily life of the thousand-year-old town; known as the "millennium-old town hanging over a waterfall". Also known as Furong Town the picturesque location dazzled with cascading waterfalls during the day and countless red lanterns at night. The Tujia stilted buildings, rice tofu workshops, and folk performances at the bonfire party made everyone feel as if they had travelled through time.

The trip to Xiangxi Prefecture was even more exciting. The Hongshilin (Red Stone Forest), a wonder of Cambrian red carbonate geology, revealed its uncanny craftsmanship through changing light and shadow; the cliff plank road in Dehang Grand Canyon and the engineering marvel of Aizhai Bridge stood in striking contrast to intangible cultural heritage such as Miao embroidery and batik, where natural grandeur collided with human ingenuity. In Shibadong Miao Village, photographers focused on the new look of the village after poverty alleviation, telling stories of people's lives in the new era through their lenses.

The journey to Fenghuang Ancient Town was full of poetry. In the early morning, the Tuojiang River was shrouded in mist, with the ancient city walls reflecting in the water; at night, the lights twinkled, and maglev trains passed by, interweaving traditional stilted buildings with modern light and shadow to form a unique visual rhythm.

On August 29, everyone participated in the "Qixi Chinese Valentine's Day - Moni Festival" folk performance, recording the romantic customs of the Tujia people amid singing and laughter.

The natural landscapes of Zhangjiajie were the grand finale. In the early morning of August 30, photographers climbed Tianzi Mountain to capture rolling clouds and mist. Three thousand towering peaks stood like they were carved by knives and axes in the morning light; the Heavenly Gate Cave and mountain cable car of Tianmen Mountain allowed everyone to immerse themselves in the majesty of the World Natural Heritage.

In the evening a Closing Ceremony took place with the awarding of "Hunan Tourism Image Ambassador" and "Excellent Organization Award" at the Photo Meeting.

Mr. Zeng Yi was awarded the FIAP Lifetime Achievement Award (LAAFIAP) for his long and valuable service in support of FIAP.

After the first phase of the 9th FIAP Photo Meeting, photographers transferred to Inner Mongolia by charter flight provided by the Organizing Committee and started their 7 days shooting tour in the vast and magnificent Xilinhot and West Ujimqin Banner in Inner Mongolia.

Inner Mongolia Segment: A Dialogue of Civilizations on the Vast Grassland (September 1 - 7)

On September 1, the photographers moved to Xilingol League, Inner Mongolia, kicking off a vast journey in the northern border.

The grassland shooting began at Erdun Aobao. The sacred sacrifice site composed of 13 Aobao stood solemnly under the blue sky and white clouds. The "Hundreds of Horses Galloping" theme shooting at Phoenix Horse Ranch was the highlight—Hundreds of horses galloped across the grassland, and in the flying dust, photographers used high-speed shutters to freeze the stunning moments of horses' hooves and manes fluttering.

The trip to Baiyin Xile Ranch was full of humanistic warmth. Static sunflower fields and dynamic horse groups complemented each other. Mongolian models in traditional costumes struck elegant poses on the grassland, and scene shooting of grassland lovers and Aobao gatherings made the romance and deep affection of these nomadic people vivid in the lenses.

The journey to West Ujimqin Banner went deep into the core of nomadic culture. At Qingquan Nomadic Culture Experience Camp, the agility of horses stepping on water splashes, the tranquility of yurt reflections, and the daily scene of milking, allowed photographers to closely capture the details of nomadic life. In the morning light of Banlashan Scenic Area, the migration of Lele carts and the silhouettes of herds grazing formed an original grassland morning melody. The Naadam Festival performances of wrestling, horse racing, and archery fully displayed the boldness and bravery of the Mongolian people.

The early morning shooting at Chaidamu Lake was extremely beautiful. The agility of white horses treading waves, the romance of horseback couples, and the tranquility of nomadic camel caravans were like dreams in the lake reflections. Despite the low temperature, photographers used their lenses to capture the first ray of light of the northern border sunrise.

From the humanistic landscapes of Hunan to the vast grasslands of Inner Mongolia, the 9th FIAP Photo Meeting was not only a grand event for photography creation but also a dialogue and exchange of civilizations. With light and shadow as their pens, photographers wrote their love for nature, culture, and life on the land of Xiangchu and the northern grasslands. These frozen moments will eventually become an eternal bridge connecting the peak of world art and the image treasures of China.

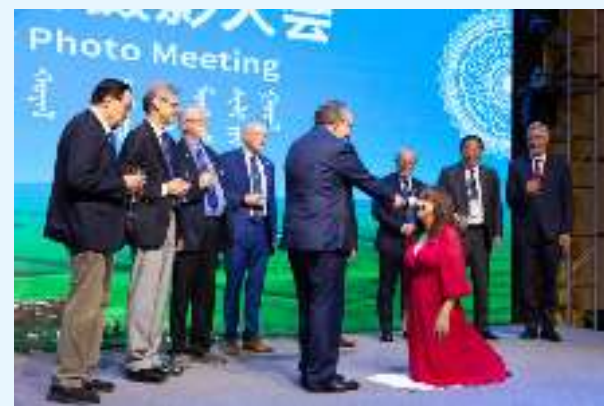

42nd FIAP Youth Biennial, Bahrain 2025

The 42nd FIAP Youth Biennial was organised in Bahrain. The FIAP Operational Member for Bahrain is the "Bahrain Arts Society - BAS".

The judging was completed on the 30th September. The judges were: David Tay Poey Cher, MFIAP, HonEFIAP from Singapore, Nasser Malek, MFIAP, ESFIAP from United Arab Emirates and Ahmed Al Busaidi, EFIAP, HonEFIAP from Oman.

We are very grateful to all the participants of this Biennial. Images were sent by 18 countries, and we received 515 photographs in total between the two age categories.

The Category I (under 16 years) section had 11 countries participate. The winner of the World Cup was Oman. The medal winning countries were Russian Federation, South Africa and Serbia. The HM's were obtained by Germany, France, Bulgaria, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Norway and Bahrain.

The Category II (under 25 years) section received collections from 18 countries. The winner of the World Cup was also Oman. The medal winning countries were South Africa, United States of America and Türkiye. The HM's were obtained by France, Germany, Russian Federation, Italy, United Arab Emirates and Egypt.

Other than the awards for the winning country teams, eleven individual awards, six FIAP medals and five awards offered by the BAS, were given in each category to the top photographs.

For the occasion, a photographic exhibition was set up in the Renaissance Palazzo dell'Annunziata, featuring unpublished and original photographs representing the important events taking place during those days. These events, organized by the two major confraternities, attract tourists from all over. One such event is the evocative Good Friday Procession. In addition to the Dead Christ carried in procession, followed by the Madonna dressed in mourning, the most significant and emotionally impactful element is the 100-piece choir singing the Requiem through the city streets. Another important event, unique in the world, is the Easter morning procession, "The Madonna Who Runs Away," which takes place in the city's Piazza Grande, packed to the brim with residents and tourists. In this event, which has historical origins, the Madonna, dressed in mourning, incredulous at the news of her Risen Son, suddenly, in the middle of the square, notices the Resurrection of Christ and, her black cloak falling, supported by a quadrille of devotees, literally "flies" toward Him, accompanied by the release of doves and the explosion of firecrackers. This event is very dear to the citizens, and from it they draw good wishes for the current year.

These were four very intense but truly beautiful days, characterized by the utmost conviviality.

The Exhibition Center's activities continued in June 2025 with the conclusion of the "Ovidio Prize 2025" International Competition, now in its 4th edition. On Saturday, June 7th, the award ceremony for the competition winners took place, along with the inauguration of the photography exhibition, showcasing the 20 photographs selected from 216 participants, with over 800 entries from around the world. 50 Photo Exhibitions of The Carpathian FIAP Exhibition Centre

In August this year, the Carpathian FIAP Exhibition Center, as one of over 30 main ambassadors of the International Federation of Photographic Arts, reached the mark of 50 photographic exhibitions organized by the center. This important result was achieved through the efforts of more than 100 photo artists from 30 countries around the world.



In particular, in 2025 alone, the Carpathian FIAP Exhibition Center presented the work of 35 authors from 20 countries around the world, who participated in the projects: "Artists defeat corruption" and "Golden Collection of World Photo Postcards".

I am proud that in the wartime conditions in Ukraine, the Carpathian FIAP Exhibition Center has become a powerful catalyst for artists to find effective ways of collaboration to implement new ideas for the development of human civilization.

In this article, I am happy to share with you, fans of photographic art, the main factors that influenced the positive dynamics of the creative path of the Carpathian FIAP Exhibition Center.

1. Historical component. Chynadiiovo Castle, in which the Carpathian Center operates, is not just a 14th-century building, but a unique spatial entity, the keeper of the still unsolved secrets of the local history of over 700 years ago.

2. Love. In the Chynadiiovo Castle of St. Nicholas, in 1682, an extraordinary great love was born, the guardian of which was the brave and courageous Ilona Zrini

(1643 – 1703). This highly educated woman, who spoke Hungarian, Croatian, Czech, Slovak, Serbian, Polish, German, French, Ancient Greek and Latin, was recognized by the elite of Europe at that time. Since the time of this outstanding princess, the Castle of St. Nicholas has been considered a fortress of lovers, unity, and a place where all endeavours become successful.

Tens of thousands of visitors to the castle annually try to look into the distant past to unravel the secret; why did the princess choose the Chynadiiovo Castle for her intimate life and the birth of important ideas of a European scale? Presentations of the achievements of world photo artists, which take place in The Carpathian FIAP Exhibition Center, create the prerequisites for the guests of the castle to open their hearts, and with a short stay in this extraordinary place, a feeling of understanding some of the key factors in solving this interesting issue appear. Therefore, contemporary artists are grateful to both the current owner of the castle and the

previous owners for the opportunity to continue their activities in the field of establishing relations between people and nations, initiated by Princess Ilona Zrini.

3. Creative people as a driving force of progress. In 2001, the state granted the St. Nicholas Castle to the artist Josyp Bartosh. Since then, the castle has begun to restore its rhythm of life; the cultural center has become famous among history and art lovers.

Since then, along with individual achievements, the role of creative unions and associations has significantly increased, the potential



of which is multiplied by the efforts of the artists of these collectives.

The Creative Union, "Photographic Art Association of Transcarpathia", began holding International Photo

Plein Airs at the castle, the first of which was organized in 2013 in collaboration with the organizers of the Silver Tatosh festival. Tatosh is the name of the legendary Transcarpathian winged horse.

One example of demonstrating the above was the organization of a photo exhibition and the activities of one of the oldest photo clubs in Europe, "RK 1924" from the city of Ružomberok, Slovakia. The Carpathian FIAP Exhibition Center presented this club's photo exhibition titled: "What interested us."

The Carpathian FIAP Exhibition Center organized Art projects "Rhythms of light" and "Aquaportraits", and personal exhibitions of photos by Mykhaylo Petskovych and Volodymyr Tatarsky

4. Preventing and eliminating corruption. By organizing exhibitions within the framework of the project "Artists defeat corruption", our center, drawing attention to corruption in the spheres of coexistence of man and nature, destroys ways of obtaining illegal benefits.

5. Education. By creating the center, artists have gained opportunities for education. We have opened our arms to creative people, providing them with exhibition spaces to present their creative achievements.

6. Good neighbourliness. The Carpathian FIAP Exhibition Center presents the creative achievements primarily of our neighbours.

A very important role in the activities of our center was played by the fact that our closest foreign artists took part in the projects: Romanians, Slovaks, Hungarians, Moldovans and Poles. Many thanks to the artists who were present at the opening of the exhibitions, namely Stefan TÓTH István and Andrzej Potera. In particular, Stefan TÓTH István AFIAP, ESFIAP, author of some of the exhibited photos, said during the exhibition opening: "I am grateful for the opportunity to present my photography as a part of this interesting project. The cooperation between the two FIAP centers, FIAP Exhibition Center Oradea (Romania) and the FIAP Exhibition Center The Carpathian (Ukraine), continues. Our initiative also launches a new collaboration between two castles in the Carpathian region; Oradea Castle (Romania) and Chynadiiovo Castle, Saint Nicholas (Ukraine)".

7. Uniqueness. The Carpathian FIAP Exhibition Center has created the "Gallery of one picture" in which a unique project is being organized, the result of which should be the "Golden Collection of World Photo Postcards" and includes the following stages:

- organizing a photo exhibition of one picture in "Gallery of one picture" (The exhibition will last 7 days);
- printing a photo postcard from a photograph that is being exhibited (Edition: 50 pieces; each photo postcard has its own number, from 1 to 50);
- distribution of photo postcards (No. 1 – to the author; No. 2 – The Carpathian FIAP Exhibition Center; No. 3 – to the exhibition curator; No. 4 – publishing house; No. 5 – Chynadiiovo Castle; No.6 – FIAP; others – online/offline sales).

The first such collection commences in 2025 and takes advantage of the opportunity for everyone to participate in this project.

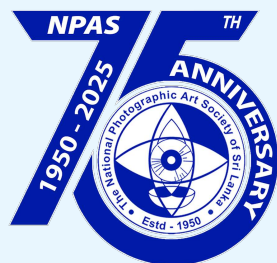

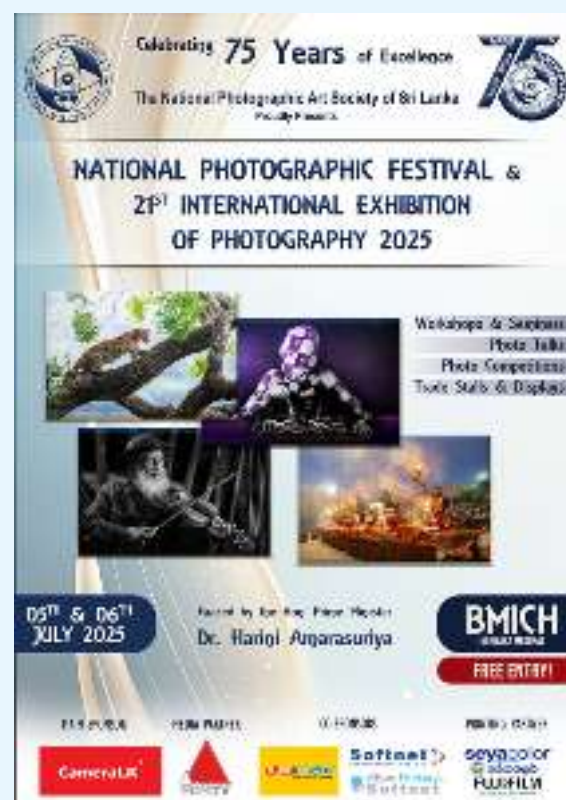
Celebrating 75 Years of Photographic Excellence in Sri Lanka

The National Photographic Art Society of Sri Lanka (NPAS) established in 1950 by the Late Mr. Wilson Hegoda, proudly marked its 75th anniversary with a grand Photographic Festival and the 21st International Exhibition, held on July 5-6, 2025, at Mihilaka Medura, BMICH, Colombo. This historic event brought together photographers, photography enthusiasts, and cultural figures from Sri Lanka and around the world.

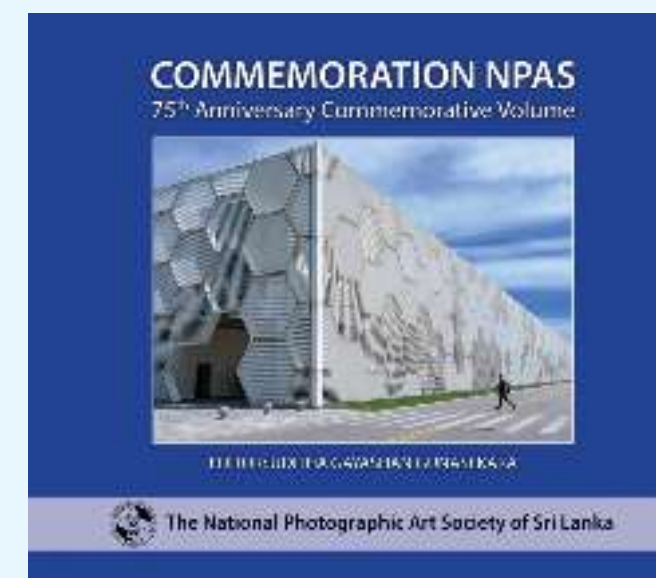

The Photographic Society of Hong Kong from 1937 to the Present

The Photographic Society of Hong Kong (PSHK) celebrated the 88th Anniversary Gala Dinner at the Grand Ballroom of the Royal Plaza Hotel on 14 June 2025. More than 200 guests attended the event. The Gala Dinner event started with a ballet model shoot, then there was the opening speech, cake cutting and awards presentation. This included the presentation of FIAP distinction diplomas and pins for those who achieved new FIAP distinctions in 2025. A Lucky Draw took place in the middle of the dinner.

The Society was established in 1937 with Walter Clark as President and Kenneth Watson as Hon. Secretary. In those days, members met in each other's homes for social and photographic purposes. Among the twenty odd early members were the late Sir Fung Ping Fan and Lord Kadoorie. One year later, when its activities to cope with member's demands were expanded to include regular meetings, lectures, and a monthly competition, the Society made its own base in the old Prince's Building, Central, Hong Kong.

The competitions then were confined to monochrome prints and entries were voted upon by all members present at the meetings. The continual growth of its membership soon made this system impracticable, and it was replaced by the present system of judging by proficient members with approved qualifications. With the development of photographic technologies in later years which made colour photography popular, competitions were extended to include colour prints and colour slide divisions.

The Society did not limit its activities to just Hong Kong. It was affiliated to the Royal Photographic Society of Great Britain (RPS) in 1938 and to the Photographic Society of America (PSA) after World War II. Members participated with much success in overseas competitions even in those early days and won awards from many international salons.

After that, the Society has held the Hong Kong International Salon of Photography every year. The opening ceremony of the 80th Hong Kong International Salon of Photography was scheduled on 8th September 2025 at the Hong Kong City Hall. In fact, the Typhoon Tapah got closest to Hong Kong in that morning. All Hong Kong shut down. Fortunately, Tapah moved far away from Hong Kong in the afternoon. The salon committee members, contractors, and the staff of the Hong Kong City Hall effectively set up the venue in couple of hours and the society was able to conduct the opening ceremony and welcome all the guests at 6 pm that evening.



We are looking forward to seeing more great photographic works from all over the world in the 81st Hong Kong International Salon of Photography next year.

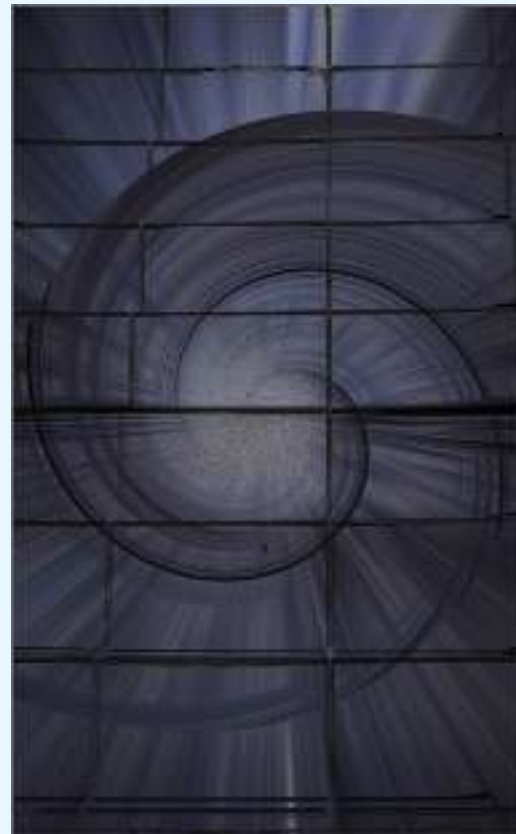

Bruny Island, Australia

Bruny Island, just off the southeast coast of Tasmania, Australia, is a very scenic and totally serene island, known for its stunning wind-swept rocky coastlines, sheltered beaches and gourmet farm-fresh produce. The Island is blessed with an extraordinarily diverse range of distinct environments. In addition to its spectacular coastlines, it has sub-alpine rainforests, a mountain summit that reaches over 570 metres, wetlands and lagoons, and rare flora and fauna.

A narrow isthmus called The Neck, splits the island into North and South Bruny. Each evening, on dusk, little penguins come ashore here and climb into the dunes to nest, a place they share with short-tailed shearwaters. You can observe this from a viewing platform and boardwalk. Higher up is Truganini Lookout that looks along the length of the neck into Adventure Bay and the South Bruny National Park. Here you can also photograph an optical illusion, which makes the sea appear higher on one side of the isthmus than the other.

Bruny island is the perfect place for the nature photographer with its natural landscapes, dramatic sea cliffs, dawn light along pristine beaches, and lush green rainforests. You can photograph an abundance of wildlife, including little Penguins, the rare White Wallaby, quolls and echidnas. Bird photographers can try their luck finding two rare, endangered species; the Forty-spotted Pardalote and the extremely colourful Swift Parrot

There are many amazingly beautiful walks, including the Peninsula Walking Track, a six-hour circuit of the Labillardiere Peninsula. This walk is noted for its many stunning views of the southern ranges, and also its snakes, namely the tiger, copperhead and white-lipped grass snake. Cape Queen Elizabeth is another lovely three-hour return walk that is photogenic.

Bruny Island is also a great place for astrophotography as it's far away from city lights, allowing you to capture crystal clear Milky Way images. The Island is also far enough south, that the Southern Aurora is regularly visible.

Many of the island's most dramatic coastal edges can only be seen from the water. It has some of Australia's tallest sea-cliffs. Cruises are available that have specially built boats that skim past sea stacks, edge into sea-caves and drift past seal colonies. Rising 114 metres above the pounding ocean is a photographic gem, Cape Bruny Lighthouse. The tours are worthwhile. There are tracks to a beach and historical graves.

The Island is exposed to the weather and changes within the day are common. Check the local weather forecast before you head out, especially on the coast or walking up a mountain. A raincoat as well as lots of warm clothing, including thermal layers and possibly a down jacket for extra warmth and comfort, should be considered essential in cooler seasons.

Chicago, Illinois, USA

There is a good reason why photographers from all over the world are drawn to Chicago. Whether your photographic interests lean to architecture, cityscapes, flora and fauna, zoo or street photography, there will be something to capture your interest.

An abundance of iconic images such as Cloud Gate in Millenium Park or the Riverwalk await you, but don't forget to explore the streets looking for what Henri Cartier Bresson referred to as "the decisive moment." You can shoot up at towering skyscrapers or shoot down from the tops of tall buildings or parking structures. Then you might explore Lower Wacker Drive which runs below the city's main streets.

The Chicago Botanical Garden offers opportunities for close-up or macro images, vistas and more intimate landscapes. Chicago also includes twenty-eight miles of Lake Michigan shoreline and thirty-three beaches, as well as the Brookfield Zoo and the Shedd Aquarium. For street photographers Chicago's Magnificent Mile stretches from the Chicago River to the north side.

Chicago boasts beautiful historic churches, including Holy Name Cathedral and North Presbyterian. It is recommended that you call ahead to arrange your photographic visit at a time that will not interfere with regular church services or events. These interiors are often dim, so it is best to have a camera with high ISO capabilities. Use a wide-angle lens, or even better, a tilt-shift lens to capture the magnificence of these structures. A small donation would also be advisable.

Chicago can be photographed at any time of the day or night. It is walkable and safer than many other cities. At night it is best, however, to stick to the Riverwalk, the Magnificent Mile and the Loop which are always packed with people.

Chicago has two airports, O'Hare and Midway. It is easy to catch a taxi, or a rideshare into the city. If you prefer, take the CTA train from the airport to downtown, a forty-five minute trip. There are numerous hotels to choose from in downtown Chicago, but regardless of where you choose to stay, be certain to visit the Hilton, formerly known as the Palmer House. This is one of the most historic hotels in the US and has many unique architectural features and a stunning lobby.

If you are looking for a photo travel destination with a lot to offer, Chicago can't be beat.

Dr Maurice Van de Wijer FIAP President from 1950 to 1976

This year, in the Memories section of FIAP News we have been featuring FIAP's past presidents. For this, our last edition of 2025, we return to FIAP's beginnings and its first and longest standing president, Dr Maurice Van de Wijer from Belgium who is considered to be the spiritual father and life leader of the International Federation of Photographic Art (FIAP).

Whilst the idea of forming an international photographic organisation is known to have occurred back as far as 1891, it was Dr. Van de Wijer that took the initiative many years later to bring this to fruition. He took the initiative to found, in the interest of photography, a world organization conceived on the modern basis of an assembly of peoples. He contacted Ernest Boesiger (Switzerland) in 1946 to tell him of his idea and offer him the role of secretary of FIAP which was initially named International Union of Photographic Societies. It was subsequently named the International Council on Photographic Art and finally the International Federation of Photographic Art.

Thus, the move to form FIAP commenced in 1946 and in 1947 eight countries became associated with this organisation. The first founding FIAP Congress was held in Berne, Switzerland from the 17th to 19th June 1950 by which time there were 17 affiliated nations. Upon the opening of the constitutive Congress of FIAP, Dr Maurice Van de Wijer said, "The year 1950 will remain engraved as a famous year in the chronicle of photography".

Born on the 1st December 1896, Maurice Van de Wijer became a physician by profession. He was also a huge football and photography enthusiast. He was the physician for the Belgium Football team. As a result, he travelled with the team, during which trips he would also form contacts with photographers worldwide.

He was the FIAP President until 1976, and then remained a member of the Directory Board until his death, in February 1994, at the age of 97 years.

I have also drawn upon the collection of pictures sent to me in 2021 by Ewa Łyczywek-Pałka, the daughter of Krystyna Łyczywek.

This section aims to showcase the work of young photographers, providing a platform for their talent and creativity.

Any photographer who is under 25 years of age is invited to send photos they have produced for possible inclusion in this gallery. Photos being sent will need to be submitted by the closing date that applies to each edition of FIAP News as shown in the rear of the magazine. Details regarding sending photos to this section of FIAP News are as follows.

Submission of Photos for the Youth Photographers Gallery

1. Photographer must be under 25 years of age as of the closing date for the FIAP News edition to which the photos are being submitted.
2. Each photographer may submit a maximum of 3 photos.
3. Photos are to be 1024pixels on the longest dimension, 96ppi, sRGB colour space and saved as the highest quality jpgs.
4. There is no set subject. Images can be colour or monochrome.
5. Strictly no nude photography.
6. All components of the final photo, and modifications of the final photo, must be the work of the photographer, eg no clipart, no other person to work on the photo, no photos that have AI created components.
7. Photographers under the age of 18 must have the consent of their parent or legal guardian to send photographs for possible publication in FIAP News.
8. Photographers must send the following with the photographs
 - a. Photographer's name
 - b. Photographer's date of birth and age as of the closing date for the FIAP News edition.
 - c. The country in which the photographer resides
 - d. A title for each photo or short text about the photo (35 words maximum).
 - e. If the photographer is under 18 years of age, an "Author's Agreement Form for Minors", signed by a parent or legal guardian, must be sent.
 - f. Photographers who are 18 years of age or older must sign and submit the adult "Author's Agreement Form".
9. Ensure that where any recognisable people are featured in the photos, that they (or their parent/guardian, if they are under 18) have given their permission for the photo to be published in FIAP News. Please read the FIAP News Regulations before signing the Author's Agreement Form.
10. The "Author's Agreement Forms", and the FIAP News Regulations to which these forms apply, can be downloaded via <https://www.fiap.net/en/services/fiap-news-service>
11. The photos, plus the required information and the applicable Authors Agreement form, must be sent to the Director of FIAP News using the file transfer service: <https://wettransfer.com/> The email address to which the transfer should be directed is fiapnewsdirector@gmail.com
12. Any questions regarding submission of images for this section should be sent to the FIAP News Director at fiapnewsdirector@gmail.com

This is not a competition. There will however be a selection made to ideally show photographs from photographers of different ages and from different countries. Technical image quality will be a consideration, but the concepts and composition will be prioritised as appropriate for the photographers age. The photographers name, age, country and the title of the photo (or text, as per point 8.d above, if provided) will be published with the selected photos.

- Maximum of 25 photos. (Banners and logos are welcome and not counted as a photo).
- FIAP Events section and Directors Notices are exempt from limit on number of photos.
- Must be provided as separate files, not embedded into article.
- Must be 1024px on longest dimension, regardless of photo orientation.
- Must be provided in sRGB colour space and saved at the highest quality jpg setting.
- A list of the image files must be provided with any applicable text that is to accompany each image, eg who and what is shown in photo. This list can either be at the bottom of the article or provided in a separate document.
- Images must be of a good quality and edited for best presentation, eg colour, cropping etc.
- If the position or order of the photos in your article is important, please put the file name in red text between paragraphs in your article and we will endeavour to place it there. Depending on page layout, it may not always be possible to place the photo exactly where you would like it.

** Please understand that the images you send may not always all be included. Space, layout, suitability for all readers and quality will be considered.

** Articles for the "Recommendations From a Local Photographer" mini article section are to be a maximum of 400 words and two photos. Up to five photos may be sent, to provide choice.
